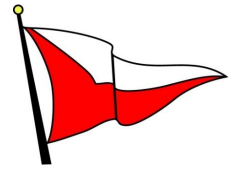

### 2024 WA Legislative Session

The 2024 legislative session concluded on March 7, and I can now report that RBAW was able to secure its top two priorities for this session!

- **\$250,000** in the state operating budget for continued funding of the [Lake Union Water Safety Initiative](#) to inform boaters and Lake Union water users how to be safe on this busy lake in downtown Seattle, which includes various recreational water use and seaplane traffic.
- **\$206,000** in the state capital budget for continued renovation work at the [Lakebay Marina](#) in the south sound. This additional money brings the total to over \$500,000 obtained over the last two legislative sessions to continue renovating the Lakebay Marina!

The short legislative sessions are seen as 'off' years where the legislature only passes supplemental budgets, but I am happy to report that this session was quite successful! RBAW secured strong wins for recreational boating this legislative session. And to the Tyee members that traveled to Olympia for Legislative Day on January 25th, your time and support makes a difference!

### Process by which a private moorage facility may sell an abandoned vessel for failure to pay moorage fees

RBAW supported HB 1919 that gives private marinas 45 days instead of 90 days after notice of failure to pay moorage fees to proceed with a forced sale of the vessel. Also, the additional requirement to publish notice in a newspaper has now been removed. The Governor signed this bill into law on March 15.

### Vessel length requirement in obtaining nonresident vessel permits

HB 1906 would have increased the allowable vessel length from 200 to 300 feet for nonresident vessels that are used commercially or in charter to get a nonresident vessel permit to operate within the state. However, it did not survive this session and died in the Senate.

### RBAW works towards a pilot stern tie program in the San Juans

RBAW continues to lobby the Washington State Parks and Recreation department to begin a pilot stern tie program in the San Juan Islands similar to the successful program run by our neighbors up north in BC. By adding metal rings driven into rocks for a stern tie with boats anchored by the bow, it would open more space for boats in crowded anchorages. Also, stern tying to a metal ring helps preserve trees and foliage often used now by boaters to secure stern placement.

### Beware of required increases in liability insurance coverage in Canada this year

Although not an entirely new concept in BC, we have heard of boaters being kicked out of a reciprocal mooring with the Saltspring Island Sailing Club (SISC) in Ganges as last year they begin requiring proof of \$2,000,000 in boat insurance liability coverage. The same is true for Fairwinds Marina (formerly Schooner Cove Marina) and possibly other privately owned marinas. We have also heard through the grapevine that SISC is considering raising that to \$3,000,000 for 2025. As always, it is best to call ahead when you are planning your itinerary if cruising north.

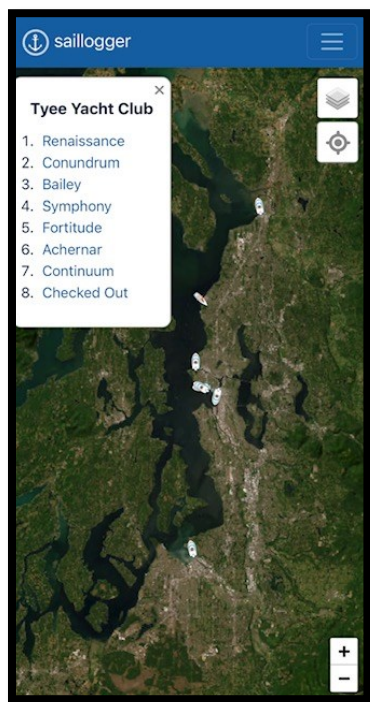

# Fun & Friends on the Water with Tyee & Saillogger Fleets!

Have you ever dropped the hook in a little cove on a gorgeous weekend in the San Juans only to find out after you left that your fellow Tyee friends were *just around the corner or at the next anchorage!!* If only you knew they were there! Or how about on the Going North Cruise and wondering how the conditions are for Scoutabout ahead of you... what is their speed and wind or have they arrived yet?



Or even... you want to get out on the water and it would be great to meet up with friends – wouldn't it be great to see where your fellow burgees are within a day cruise radius? If you have ever wondered any of these things then you will love to be a part of Saillogger's Tyee Fleet!

## What is Tyee Saillogger Fleet?

[Saillogger](#), connected to your boat's NEMA network, is a fully automated way for boaters to track and log trips, collect boat stats, remotely monitor your boat, and be a part of other boating friends and family groups through fleets! Tyee has a dedicated "Fleet" where a growing number of Tyee vessels are a part of.

On one page, you can see all the vessels who are part of the "Tyee Fleet" and locations on a map. You are able to click each boat and see where they are or what the conditions are currently.

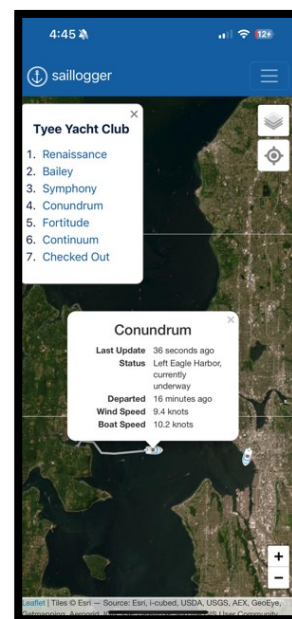
Additionally, Fleets gives you the ability to see real-time vessel positions underway (all private within the fleet), most recent tracks, notes added for those tracks and even weather reports from the boat's current location.

Moreover, when you reach a new destination, Saillogger informs you about nearby Tyee Fleet members, facilitating spontaneous meet-ups or sundowners, so you never miss a chance to connect with your fellow Tyee members!

Saillogger was developed by Tyee members Ilker & Kat on [SV Renaissance](#) to document and log their sailing adventures up on the West Coast. *"We found the more boating we did, the more features we wanted and we just kept updating and building more functionality,"* Ilker said. Once we started showing Saillogger to fellow boaters, everyone wanted to be a user and especially our own Tyee members.

Kevin & Bonnie on MV *Continuum* have been early adopters of Saillogger since 2021 and inspired us to build the Fleets functionality. *"I'm an active user of Saillogger and I'm really excited to use Fleets with Tyee. Being able to see friends wherever they are is fantastic and to have it on one uncluttered page is great!"* says Kevin.

Craig & Andrea on MV *Conundrum* have also been prominent users and supporters of Saillogger, and strong proponents of expanding the Tyee fleet. Craig remarks, *"Thanks to Saillogger, most of our logging and tracking is now completely automated! Our friends and family love the ability to see our trips through the Timelapse feature – every boater should use this app!"*

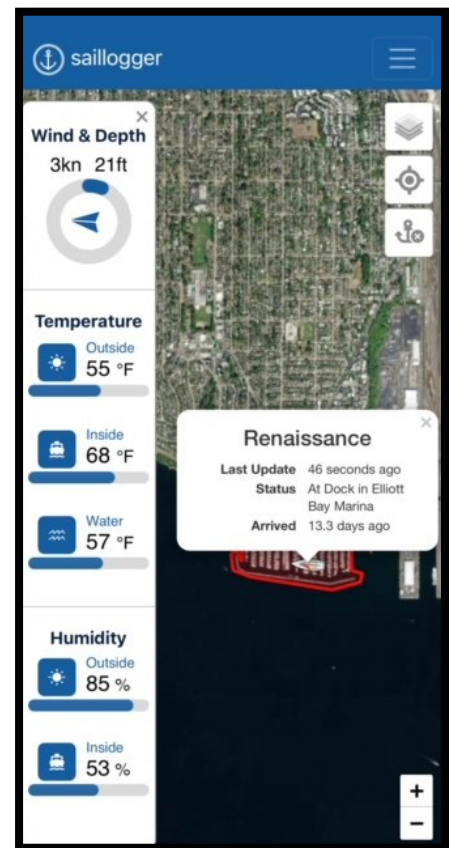
Saillogger is being used by hundreds of boaters around the world (60+ countries and counting). From friends buddy-boating the inside passage of Alaska, to the masses island hopping in the Caribbean from Florida to Bahamas, to others who are currently transiting the Pacific, Atlantic, and Indian Oceans!

## How to Join Saillogger Tyee Fleets?

Saillogger connects directly with your existing boat network or boat computer via NEMA. If you have a Victron Cerbo GX device or are running Signal K, you can easily create an account online and connect your boat immediately. If you are unsure about your boat's systems or have questions, feel free to [email us](#) – we're happy to chat you through the process!

[Saillogger](#) is free to try for 45 days and is available to Tyee members at a discounted rate of \$4.99/month, which includes all features and tech support. Boats joining from the Tyee family will be automatically enrolled in the Tyee Saillogger Fleet (which is private to Tyee members only). You can see more about Saillogger [here](#). Use the promo code "TYEEYC" while signing up to take advantage of the special rate and to automatically get added to the fleet. If you don't want to link your boat, you can still create an account and view the Tyee fleet completely free.

# Reciprocals Report

Welcome, reciprocals adventurers! This month we are beginning our exploration of the reciprocal moorage that could be available to you as a member of the Tyee Yacht Club – Seattle. I say “Seattle”, because there is also a Tyee Yacht Club in Portland. They are indeed a reciprocal partner, but since they are in Oregon, specifics on them will have to wait. There is also a Tyee Marina in Tacoma – they are not a yacht club and not a reciprocal partner, so if you tell someone that you are with the Tyee Yacht Club, and they say, “in Tacoma?” you will know what they are talking about.

Trivia question: How many yacht clubs are in Lake Washington? As far as Yacht Destinations knows (my source), there are three. Did you get it right? Their names are Meydenbauer Bay, Rainier, and Bellevue YCs. Seattle and Queen City YCs are actually in Portage Bay, not technically Lake Washington, though for today’s discussion, we are going to include them.

Seattle and Meydenbauer YCs are not reciprocal partners of ours. They each have a club rule that reciprocals must be further than a certain distance from their facility, and we just don’t qualify. However, Seattle YC will welcome you to use the restaurant – you just can’t bring your boat. Even without these two, there are still three reciprocal moorage options for those of you who like to stay in the fresh water:

## Reciprocals - Lake Washington/Portage Bay:



**Bellevue Yacht Club** is located in the Newport Yacht Basin. There is reciprocal space up to 45’ total length up to 48 hours. The office is open from 8 am – 8 pm. Call ahead if arriving after 8 pm. Water and restrooms are at the facility. They are three miles from the mall with shopping, restaurants, and entertainment.



**Queen City Yacht Club** is a member of the Grand 14. It is located just around the corner from our clubhouse on the west side of Portage Bay. They have 100’ of reciprocal space available adjacent to 520 freeway. As a guest, you have access to the clubhouse, with lunch served on Friday and breakfast on Saturday.



**Rainier Yacht Club** is a member of the Grand 14 and is located at the south end of Lake Washington at the Parkshore Marina. They have room for (1) 30’ and (1) 40’ boat. You can stay as long as a week if no other boats are waiting. Potable water, restrooms, showers, laundry, and WiFi, with dining and shopping within walking distance.

You can have an inexpensive boating vacation without ever leaving the lake. Just make sure to confirm the details on Sign In - Yachting Destinations or on Tyee’s website before you go. Remember, reciprocals are first come, first served, so have a plan B just in case.

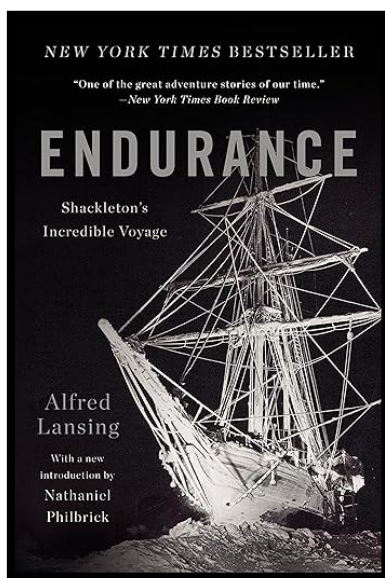
