


In closing, we wish all of our Tyee friends and confidents fair winds and following seas and look forward to enjoying life more with you all soon.

Board Chair's Report

Light! There is more light! I have really noticed the days getting longer, as they do every year about this time, thanks to our orbit around the sun, the earth's tilted axis, and all the associated astrophysics stuff. But that's not important right now. Rather, let's just enjoy the longer days and the resulting prospects of the coming boating season. I will leave it to our bridge officers to share all the fun stuff coming up in that realm. Instead, I'll shed some light on a few of the pragmatic, mundane, but important aspects of our club that the board has been dealing with.

On our tenant front, our Clubhouse Management Committee Chair, PC JoAnn Jordan and myself held our annual walkthrough with Kat of The Extra Ingredient (TEI) in late January. Everything is looking good as they are doing an excel-



lent job of keeping up the interior and the equipment that fall under their responsibility. We also had a brief discussion to cover a few areas for improvement based on feedback I have received from members, as well as our own observations. That discussion went well and will help continue our strong relationship with TEI. Kat also shared that they attended the Wedding Show and have been getting great response with bookings this summer. However, they are still stretched on cash flow through the spring, so asked for two more months of 50% rent abatement. This request was approved by the board at our February meeting. It results in about an additional \$9,600 net loss of revenue for Tyee. This will hopefully give them a financial runway into the summer that will let them build the reserves they will need to get through next winter without our assistance.

On a positive revenue front, we just completed our annual membership renewals which, as usual, resulted in a substantial influx of cash. I want to give a big shout out to Treasurer Alan Scott who went above and beyond in coordinating and following up on all our renewals. Also, Trustee Juli Auckerman was a great help in proactively getting all the new membership cards together and distributed to renewing – and new – members. All told, we had 149 members renew. Unfortunately, we had 22 members withdraw from Tyee or about 13% of our membership, which is typical although still disappointing. 

Rear Commodore's Report

Greetings my fellow Tyee Members!

Here it is March already, and only two months to the opening of boating season, which we're all looking forward to.

In preparation, we have some facility maintenance that needs to be addressed before Opening Day.

We have scheduled two work parties for Tyee West (Outstation). March 23rd for dock maintenance (flipping the deck boards). And the second work party is scheduled for April 5, 6, and 7. Details for both work parties are on the calendar. If you plan on attending either or both please register online: Outstation in March &/or Clubhouse in April. No charge, just head count needed for planning purposes.

For Tyee East (Main Clubhouse) Commodore Rick and I did a walkthrough and identified a list of tasks that need to be completed before Opening Day. I will schedule a Work Party in March and possibly a second one in April. The list is long though many hands should make light work. I will announce these dates soon.

Maritime Minute:

Sound Signals in Restricted Visibility (fog)

The following rules pertain to daytime and nighttime.

A power-driven vessel making way (moving) through the water shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes one long blast (4 to 6 seconds).

A power-driven vessel underway (a vessel not at anchor, or made fast to the shore, or aground) but stopped and making no way through the water shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes 2 prolonged blasts in succession with an interval of about 2 seconds between them.

A vessel not under command, a vessel restricted in her ability to maneuver, fishing, engaged in towing or pushing, shall sound at intervals of not more than 2 minutes three blasts in succession, one long and two short blasts in succession.

Reciprocals Report

Last month we explained what reciprocals are. This month, we're going to delve into the ever-so-useful *Yacht Destinations* website. You can go directly to their site at <u>Sign In - Yachting Destinations</u>. You'll need to create an account, if you haven't already set one up. Or if you don't want to create and keep track of another account and password, you can also access *Yacht Destinations* through Tyee's webpage at <u>TYEE Yacht Club.</u> That's probably the easiest way. You'll need to sign in to access the members' only information.

Don't have a Tyee account yet? You'll want to take care of that right now. You'll be glad you did. I'll wait... Now that we've taken care of that, sign into Tyee's website and take a look at all the useful information at your fingertips. Who knew, right?

After that brief commercial break, let's get back to "Recip" business. From the menu on the left, select "Tyee Reciprocal List". This will open a page titled Tyee Yacht Club – Seattle, Our Reciprocal Clubs. Under the title are three tabs - **Details**, **Map**, and **Our Facilities**.

The **Details** tab lists all our reciprocal clubs in alphabetical order. The list has each club's burgee, a link to their webpage, and the City, Region, and District that the club is located in. The globe icon under the *Map* column takes you to a nice Google map of their location with latitude and longitude. The *Info* column has all the information that the club has provided under a series of tabs. More user friendly is the *Print* icon. This takes you to a one-page printable form with all the "Info" for that club in one place.

The list of clubs under the **Details** tab can be filtered to better target the area that you are interested in. Go to the <u>State/Province</u> field and select the down arrow. You will see a drop-down menu. Select from that list, and then go to the <u>Region</u> field where, depending on the area, there will be another drop-down menu. For example, select the <u>Province</u> of British Columbia, then select Vancouver Area under <u>Region</u>. Your options will go from nearly 100 to 10. Nice!

Another way to find potential reciprocal moorage is to use the **Map** tab on the main page. This will take you to another Google map with yellow pendants marking the location of all our reciprocal partners. From there it is easy to see that we have six opportunities south of the Narrows Bridge and three in the Tri-Cities area, handy if you have a trailerable boat.

The third tab is **Our Facilities**. This is the information that other clubs see about our reciprocal space on Lake Union. You might find that interesting. My suggestion is just to explore the site. Have fun. You can't break it.

Next month we'll start exploring some of our reciprocal partners. If you have a favorite, please let me know which and why, and we will share it. Also, if you are interested in being on the Reciprocals Committee, please contact me at reciprocals@tyeeyachtclub.org.



March Book Club

Our next Tyee Book Club Meeting will be on Thursday, March 28th, at 7:00 pm. We'll be discussing *Homewaters* by local author David B. Williams. David recently spoke at a WIC Luncheon—his writing and stories are engaging, inspiring, and educational.



Not far from Seattle skyscrapers live 150-year-old clams, more than 250 species of fish, and underwater kelp forests as complex as any terrestrial ecosystem. For millennia, vibrant Coast Salish communities have lived beside these waters dense with nutrient-rich foods, with cultures intertwined through exchanges across the waterways. Transformed by settlement and resource extraction, Puget Sound and its future health now depend on a better understanding of the region's ecological complexities.

Focusing on the area south of Port Townsend and between the Cascade and Olympic mountains, Williams uncovers human and natural histories in, on, and around the Sound. In conversations with archaeologists, biologists, and tribal authorities, Williams traces how generations of humans have interacted with such species as geoducks, salmon, orcas, rockfish, and herring. He sheds light on how warfare shaped development and how people have moved across this maritime highway, in canoes, the mosquito fleet, and today's ferry system. The book also takes an unflinching look at how the Sound's ecosystems have suffered from human behavior, including pollution, habitat destruction, and the effects of climate change.

Witty, graceful, and deeply informed, Homewaters weaves history and science into a fascinating and hopeful narrative, one that will introduce newcomers to the astonishing life that inhabits the Sound and offers longtime residents new insight into and appreciation of the waters they call home.*
