Greetings All-



It is the true story of the recovery operation from the SS Central America and all of its treasure. **Ship of Gold in the Deep Blue Sea** tells the story of the sinking of




the SS Central America, a side-wheel steamer carrying nearly six hundred passengers returning from the California Gold Rush, two hundred miles off the Carolina coast in September 1857. Over four hundred lives and twenty-one tons of California gold were lost. It was the worst peacetime disaster at sea in American history, a tragedy that remained lost in legend for over a century*.

Gary Kinder tells an extraordinary tale of history, human drama, heroic rescue, scientific ingenuity, and individual courage. We will be inviting the author to attend our meeting. We hope many Tyee members can come and enjoy this interesting experience. Ship of Gold in the Deep Blue Sea is a testament to the human will to triumph over adversity. It is also a great American adventure story of the opening of Earth's last frontier.

The author, Mr. Kinder will be joining our virtual book club on May 25th and we encourage all who have an interest in the subject to attend the meeting. Reading the book is not a requirement for attend-
