With the winter solstice behind us—every day is now getting longer and longer—before we know it, we'll be back out cruising in the warm sunshine.



Keep Taking Your Vitamins!



Legislative Day

Where has the year gone! It's time to start planning for the annual RBAW & NMTA Legislative Day where RBAW schedules time with key legislators to discuss important recreational boating issues and opportunities! This important aspect of our government at work will be held on January 18, 2022. The upcoming 2022 Legislative Session is a short, mid-biennium 60-day session intended to address emerging needs that can't wait for the next full session in 2023.

RBAW will be seeking meetings with key legislators to discuss the RBAW 2022 priorities, such as derelict vessel removal funding, boating safety (SUP PFD proposed rules), mobile pumpouts, and the emerging Lake Union/Kenmore Air minimize boater-seaplane conflicts. Zoom meetings will be scheduled (like last year) with legislators for 1/18/22, and RBAW will send out an RBAW event announcement with this schedule in the next few weeks—please stay tuned!

Please SAVE THE DATE, and you'll receive the event invite and agenda of meetings within the next few weeks. Let me know if you have any questions about Leg Day!
