#### Commodore's Report



#### Rear Commodore's Report

Hello Tyee Family — I figured I'd start in the next few reports to give some background and insight into the role of the Rear Commodore and share more around our involvement in the Grand 14. For those who are new to the club, or haven't been on the Bridge, hopefully this will demystify what this is all about.

As Rear Commodore, most of you know my focus is on our building and grounds. Luckily, I am supported by the club with our clean-up events, members who additionally volunteer their time and resources, and also the Lease Committee.

In this post, I'll **share a bit more on the Lease Committee**. The Lease Committee is comprised of JoAnn Jordan (chair), Audrey Hicks, Damian Sevilla, Lynda Woodward and myself, as the Rear Commodore. As we have transitioned from having a tenant to running events ourselves with an event manager, the lease committee's focus has been on answering a few questions: What is the right model moving forward for Tyee Yacht Club? How do we ensure we are maintaining key activities required to run an event facility? and How do we keep the facilities up-to-date and guarantee an income stream for the club? To do this, the lease committee has been meeting weekly for 1.5 hours to understand options and begin the work to lease out our club. **Over the next couple months, our goal will be to a) find the best tenant/usage for our club and b) continue to ensure we manage the ongoing projects already planned.** 

We will continue to give updates on that work through the monthly dinner meetings and the Echo Board. At a high level though, we have some prospective tenants who have reached out to us already, and we will broaden that search by using brokers, who will connect us with further tenants. If we ultimately rent to those who already reached out to us, we don't pay a broker; if a broker finds us a tenant, we will pay a fee for this service. The prospective tenants will give us a proposal for how they will use the space, their marketing plan, etc. Our job will be to evaluate what is the best for our club and ultimately bring to the Tyee Board for final decision making. I do want to call out the great experiences and dedication this group has brought to this work. I'm confident together we will come to a great next step for Tyee.

I'd also like to give **some insight into The Grand 14 Yacht Clubs of Puget Sound**, an interclub association of boating organizations in the Pacific Northwest. The Grand 14 started as a way to create fellowship amongst a group of boating clubs; indeed I am finding it is a great place to bounce off ideas and learn how each club engages their membership. You hear about this with the WIC luncheons as well as when your Bridge talks about the Junior Officers (JO) and Commodore Balls. This month, I'll share a typical weekend (if there is such a thing!) for a Rear Commodore. Friday night starts off with the Rear and Vice Commodores of the Grand 14

having a social put on by the host Rear and Vice. Saturday we tend to socialize during the day and that night is the JO Ball, a themed party put on by the host club for their membership and to honor their Junior Officers. As guests, we are all introduced to their membership. So far, I have attended "The Big Game," "Barnyard Bash" and "M\*A\*S\*H" from the popular TV show. Sunday, concludes with our class business meetings to take care of key items. Yours truly is the Social Media Chair for the 2022 class — The Tritons.

Each Grand 14 club holds their JO Ball every other year. The 2018 Tyee theme was "A Night at the Zoo." Some may have noticed my Facebook post that Julie Shinn was kind enough to let me know that our upcoming Commodore's Ball "Dancing in the Clouds" will be at the Tyee Clubhouse. Well as a newer member, knowing that Dorothy and Larry Dubia, Junior Officers at the time, volunteered at the zoo, and with no address on the invite, I thought, oh, we are the Woodland Park Zoo. Luckily, my Uber driver was kind enough to not leave a stranded, costumed giraffe at the zoo in the dark. So, know that our balls are all held at our fabulous Tyee East facility. Stay tuned for the announcement by the planning committee (comprised of Past Commodores) on the Tyee JO Ball theme in March.



There will be approximately one chaperone per guest; you set the limit on the number of extra people that you want onboard. We are

looking for volunteers for both hosting on their boat (must be powerboat at least 26 feet in length, sorry no sail-boats) or at the clubhouse to help with coordination of guests.
